



### **Wanted Poster Directions:**

After we've selected groups, you will meet to discuss your designated writing form. From discussion and any reference materials you choose (readings, writing) you will create a Wanted Poster for your writing form. Each group will need to nominate a speaker to present their poster to the class.

Your wanted poster needs to include **3** parts. You should include a profile, or description, including at least **5** of the distinct features of the form. Second, we want to know where your writing form might be today, so – include at least **2** speculations about where we might find your writing form in the real world. Lastly – include a list of at least **3** writing "crimes" for your form. This should include **3** felony offenses – offenses that when committed really make your particular form of writing *bad*. What would you caution others against as they move into final copy, if they are drafting your form?

Notes:

You should be considering the points made by each group, but especially the group that covers the forms you have chosen for your final draft. As you move into your final revisions, how can you put to use what the group has suggested?

Guiding Questions:

- Ø What are the qualities, applications, and pitfalls in the writing form you have chosen?
- Ø How is your writing synthesizing purpose and form?
- Ø Have you met your writing aim?
- Ø Is your reader asking "so what?"
