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ASSESSMENT MONITORING

This is a friendly reminder for Local Education Agencies (LEAs) only in Group B of the [Assessment Monitoring Cycle](#), their LEA's Comprehensive Assessment Plans are due **April 30, 2018**.

The comprehensive assessment plan is a living document. It will guide the work of LEAs while also developing an excellent training tool for staff. This document will inform stakeholders (e.g. parents, administrative staff, etc.) the purpose of assessment, when and which assessments are administered, how results are used to improve instruction, and demonstrate how assessments will improve student learning. This document not only meets accountability compliance with

the State Department of Education, but it helps guide LEA's comprehensive assessment systems along with illustrating their tremendous efforts already accomplished.

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COLLEGE ENTRANCE EXAMS

ACCUPLACER

Testing windows are winding down! The testing windows are:

- ACCUPLACER Placement: **February 5-April 30, 2018**
 - **26 days left!**
- ACCUPLACER Diagnostic: **February 5-May 5, 2018**
 - **31 days left!**

ACCUPLACER Placement:

- Students on an IEP may take this assessment if their IEP Team determines this assessment is the most appropriate
- This assessment determines if a student is prepared for a college-level course per domain
- A shorter assessment, with 12 to 20 questions per domain
- Meets the College Entrance Exam graduation requirement

ACCUPLACER Diagnostic:

- This assessment assesses and focuses on a student's strengths and weaknesses per domain
- Longer assessment, 40 questions per domain
- OPTIONAL ASSESSMENT – The SDE is recommending if a student scores low within a domain when they take their ACCUPLACER Placement assessment, they take the ACCUPLACER Diagnostic in that specific domain. To see what a low, middle, or high score is, please view the [Score Interpretation Guide](#). This will help students, guidance counselors, teachers, and families understand and guide the student. Please use the IEP team's best judgement if a student should take the Diagnostic

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SAT

*Idaho SAT School Day: **April 10, 2018***

Pre-Test Session FAQs:

Pre-ID Label and Bubbling in Demographics on Student Answer Sheet – Is this required?

College Board is reporting and you will see in test admin scripts that students are to still bubble in certain demographics such as name/birthdate/grade etc. on their answer sheets even if the pre-ID label is correct. College Board reports that this serves as their secondary validation to ensure the responses match the student. Occasionally, an answer sheet with label is passed out to the wrong student. Yikes!

Can I have students fill out demographic info and questionnaire before the test?

Since there is no essay this year, you can facilitate students completing the questions on the answer sheet prior to the test starting. To note, if you opt to do this, testing still needs to conclude before students are dismissed for lunch. The full session would be about 4 hours and 30 minutes.

Can students complete or finish filling out any questions *after the test*?

Students can complete any necessary info after testing, but use care as this is now their “live” answer sheet. Ensure the student fully completes the information, as test answer sheets will be picked up the following day.

Materials Shipment Updates:

It is vital to ensure you have enough paper materials for any day of testing needs. Please ensure your recent deliveries includes enough for your anticipated day of “bubbling in” test takers.

What is optional on student questionnaire/response sheet?

The required fields are indicated on the response sheet. If you are limited on time and students are interested in reporting to College Board information around their current and anticipated classes, AP classes etc. They can simply opt in the ‘student search’ and this trumps the detailed class questions. Another option is to have students go online and complete the remaining questions via their College Board account.

Makeup test date: April 24, 2018

College Board will be sending a makeup test day form to all test supervisors immediately after the SAT Day. Please respond to this required form ASAP even if you do not have makeup testers. The form also serves as the mechanism for reporting test irregularities and improprieties. The College Board will review and alert schools as to whether these students can participate in the makeup exam.

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STUDENT ENGAGEMENT SURVEY

The student engagement survey is now live! On Monday, we provided superintendents with links to the new student engagement survey. Superintendents are responsible for sharing these links with principals and other staff to facilitate the administration of the survey in accordance with the Idaho's new accountability system. This email also included additional information about the survey and contact information for technical support. As a reminder, students in grades 3-8 need to take the survey using the custom links prior to the end of the survey window closing on May 31, 2018.

Some superintendents and charter administrators may have received links from AdvancED last week welcoming them to the eProve platform. These emails were automatically generated when AdvancED created eProve profiles for districts as part of our onboarding process. These links were not the survey links, instead they provided access to the platform districts can use to administer and review data from various AdvancED surveys. These links expired after 24 hours. WARNING

- Allow students to review questions before pausing the test. If a test is paused and resumed after 20 minutes, the student cannot review previously flagged or answered questions.
- (For ELA and Math ISAT) Allow students to complete the current segment before moving to the next segment. If a student moves to the next segment, the student cannot review questions in the previous segment.
- Immediately discontinue testing by pausing the test when:
 - encountering unexpected technical difficulties. Report any audio, video, or platform issues to the AIR helpdesk at 1-844-560-7365 or IDHelpDesk@air.org.
 - student apathy or known/unexpected medical/behavioral conditions are observed. Reschedule when appropriate.

- Submit the test only when the student is finished. The test cannot be reverted to the un-submitted status.

ISAT Testing Week 2 in review

I had many accountability and accessibility questions last week. To review, there is only *school* accountability for ISAT participation, not individual student accountability or an ISAT test requirement for graduation. If a school enrolls a student in grade 11 or 12 from another state or in-state having not previously taken the ISAT ELA or Math test, you do not need to test them on ELA/literacy or Math assessments. You may need to give them a Science EOC by grade 12, as Science participation currently occurs for the school by looking at seniors.

Accessibility questions varied but a few key aspects of designated supports to consider.

- Supports and / or accommodations should be consistent with what is normally provided in the classroom

- Involve students in the discussion about supports/accommodations when possible
- Insure that students know how to use the supports and allow them to practice with those supports in the testing interface prior to the operational ISAT

Available for ELA/Literacy, Math, Science or Alternate Assessment in English and/or Spanish. These will be mailed directly to districts and arrive just after the close of the regular test window.

NEW to ISAT Reports this Year

Students will receive a Lexile measure on the ISAT English Language Arts/Literacy Assessment which will be reported on the Individual Score Report.

Students will also receive a Quantile measure on the ISAT Mathematics Assessment, reported on their Individual Score Report.

As Lexiles and Quantile Measures are reported for many assessments and instructional products, students may receive multiple Lexile or Quantile measures each year. Educators may find that a student's measures vary within a product or when comparing measures from different assessments, and they might be unsure how to interpret these differences. 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IDAHO READING INDICATOR

Legislative Update

What's the plan for implementing the new Idaho Reading Indicator this fall?

The replacement for the legacy Idaho Reading Indicator is a technology based assessment provided by Istation. Statewide implementation was fully funded and all Idaho public school students in kindergarten through third grade will take the new IRI beginning Fall 2018.

The state's contract includes the screener and diagnostic assessments, progress monitoring and comprehensive data reporting for students (parents), teachers, and schools, at no cost to districts.

Here are some of the key action items for districts and charter schools to begin considering:

- Make sure elementary principals are aware.
- Ensure your technology coordinator is aware of this new technology-based assessment and to expect communication from the SDE.
- Identify a three- to four-member Implementation Team who will attend state training and lead your local implementation.
- Send your Implementation Team to regional training in June (Dates TBD)
- Plan with your team how to roll out training for your teachers on the assessment and the tools provided.
- Plan to communicate with parents about the new assessment.

Data Validation is Active: April 2-April 6, 2018. Required task prior to receiving score reports.

This important pre-reporting task will allow you to correct any student demographics and merge certain domains that have been scored but may not reflect a composite score due to the need to merge. Important in particular to pay attention to EDU IDs for accuracy.
