March 28 – May 20, 2016	ISAT- Math and ELA	Required for Grades 3-8 and 10 (Grade 9 & 11-optional)
March 28 – May 20, 2016	ISAT –Science	ISAT Science -Required for Grades 5 and 7
February 08 – May 20, 2016	End-of-Course Science (Biology and Chemistry)	The EOC is a component of the Comprehensive Assessment Program as stated in 08.02.03.111.06. The High School End of Course in Biology or Chemistry is administered in the spring to students in grades 10–12.
March 28 – May 6, 2016	ISAT Alt. Assessment Math & ELA 1% of population	These tests have replaced the previous Grade 10 ISAT Science test. Required for Grades 3-8 and 11
October 19, 2015 – February 26, 2016	ISAT Alt. Science	Required for Grades 5, 7, and 10. IPASS Closing February 26, 2016 at midnight (12:00 am MST.)
August 26, 2015 - March 25, 2016	Optional Interim Assessment	Optional Comprehensive and Block Assessments Grade 3-8 and HS
April 12, 2016	SAT School Day Administration	11th Grade, state funded college entrance exam, SAT (ACCUPLACER Diagnostic no longer meets the CEE requirement. ACCUPLACER Placement will be available for a select group of students.)
April 27, 2016	SAT (Make-up)	Make-up date requires transfer of student registration with the College Board.
October 14, 2015	PSAT	State-wide Optional Sophomore Administration (state-funded)
April 04 – May 02, 2016	Idaho Reading Indicator (IRI), Spring	Spring Reporting/Discrepancy Window Closes May 25, 2016
April 04 – May 02, 2016	Idaho Reading Indicator (IRI), Alt.	K-2 Spring Administration Only
August 17 - September 25, 2015	Idaho Reading Indicator (IRI), Fall	Fall Reporting/Discrepancy Window Closes October 16, 2015(Optional Winter Testing: January-February, 2016)

DATES	ASSESSMENTS	NOTES
March 01 – May 27, 2016	PIRLS	International comparative study of the reading literacy of young students. PIRLS studies the reading achievement and reading behaviors and attitudes of 4th-grade students in the U.S. and participating countries. Schools are randomly selected throughout the U.S.
District/School Determination	Civics	Students will demonstrate a knowledge and understanding of the fundamentals of United States history and the principles and form of United States government.
		The State Department of Education will not create a test form. The law is specific in requiring students to take the 100 questions from the United States Citizenship and Immigrations Services Naturalization Test. View the <u>USCIS website</u> and find resources including study guides, classroom materials, and the test questions. A school district or public charter school shall document on the pupil's transcript that the pupil has passed; passing threshold is determined by the school district or public charter school.
February 8 – March 18, 2016	WIDA – ACCESS 2.0 Idaho's English Language Assessment	ACCESS 2.0 for ELLs (Assessing Comprehension and Communication in English State-to-State for English Language Learners) is a secure large-scale English language proficiency assessment given to Kindergarten through 12th graders who have been identified as English language learners (ELLs).
January 25 – March 04, 2016	NAEP	In 2016, NAEP will administer mathematics, reading, and writing assessments on tablets with keyboards at grades 4 and 8. NAEP will also administer an arts (music and visual arts) assessment to grade 8 students. Schools selected to participate will be contacted in August.
October 05 – November 13, 2015	PISA	International assessment that measures 15-year-old students' reading, mathematics, and science literacy every three years.
April 15, 2016	Assessment Monitoring Materials Due	Submissions reviewed by May 15th. Unapproved submission will need to be resubmitted with further evidence by June 15th.
