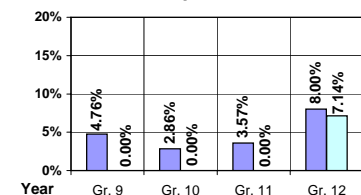
Literacy coach to mentor staff with reading and writing strategies.	One on one mentoring and coaching in the classrooms by Dr. Leona Manke.

Introduce parent education classes (Los Ninos) in the Family Learning Center.	Classes are being taught in Spanish and English several times per week.
Implement Read Right program during the instructional day and after school program.	The first series of training has been completed and remedial assistance for reading is being provided for students in grades three through high school.
Continue intensive review and training with SIOP.	Staff development days and after school professional development time has been allotted for SIOP training.
Continue using "High Performing Learning Community" domains for school and district internal assessment. Facility improvement with a second bond for voter approval for renovation and/or a new elementary school.	Bond was run in October of 2007 and failed by seven votes. A second bond is scheduled for June of 2008.

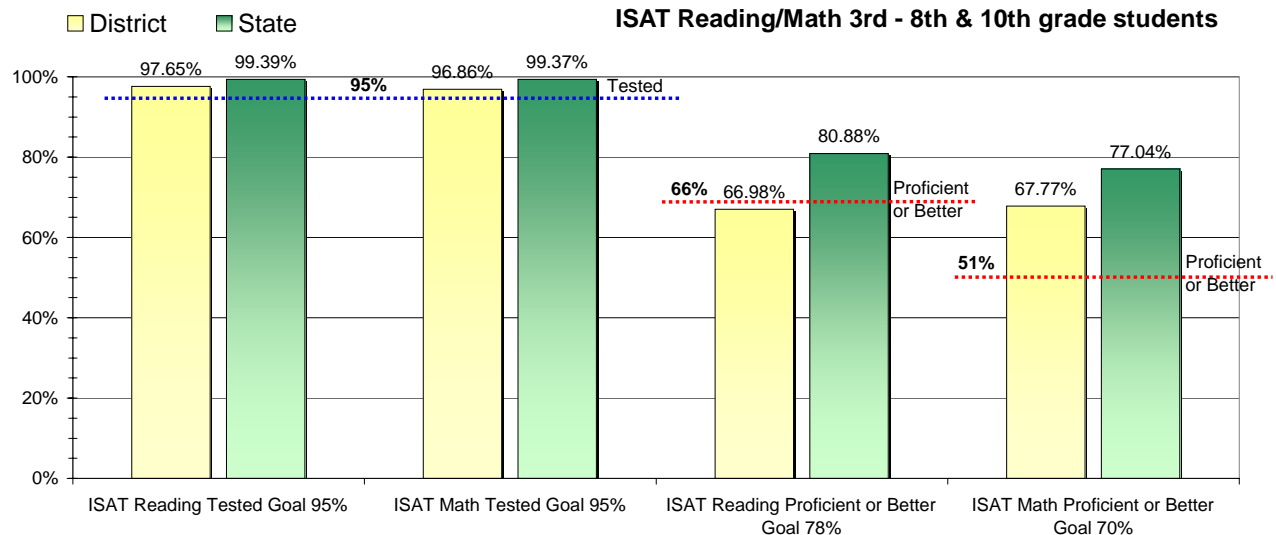
Adequate Yearly Progress and Assessment 2006-07
