Our District is one of the (fifth) fastest growing in Idaho. Our goal is to be proactive in the facilities planning process.

We are working in cooperation with local developers and have received or are in the process of requesting land donations sites for 5 elementary, 2 middle and 1 high school sites.

Financial accountability to our students, staff and patrons is of the utmost importance to our District.

The School Board Members, Administration and Staff continue to seek ways to supplement our budget through grants, donations, etc.

Communication with all of our stakeholders continues to be a priority with our School Board Members and Administrative Team.

We continue publishing newsletters for Board members, staff and patrons on a regular basis, as well as utilizing the website for communication.

Teacher collaboration time focused on increasing student academic achievement is a continued goal.

We are seeing tremendous student academic growth, throughout our District. The GT program and staff were expanded to include opportunities for additional exceptional students.

Our District's circumstances of a fire on February 1, 2007 (which destroyed 75% of our High School) created a goal of finding adequate space for the continued quality education of our High School students in the interim time before the High School could be reopened.

Our Middle School rearranged their schedule to allow the High School to utilize some of their classrooms / office space and the High School Annex / Fine Arts Center were utilized during the remainder of the 2007 school year. Due to proactive planning (Ten-Year-Plan) for future growth, the District was able to acquire 10 portables in a short time for 18 additional classrooms for the 2007-08 school year.

The opening of our rebuilt High School in time for students return in the fall of 2008.

The reconstruction of the High School is on schedule and set for opening in the fall of 2008.
