Highlights

The Troy and Kendrick Board of Trustees approved hiring one School Superintendent to be shared between the two districts for the 2006-2007 School Year. Neither district could afford a fulltime Superintendent under the State's funding formula for administrators. The Superintendent divided his time approximately two and one half days per week in each district. The School Boards have stated that the Superintendent's shared services and costs have worked out to be beneficial for both districts.

After several years of working out the details to sell the Old Troy High, the building was sold in December of 2006 to a local property owner. The new owner has expressed an interest in preserving the old school to remodel it as a community center, living facilities, and/or business offices.

The Troy School District was successful in passing a Supplemental Tax Override levy with approximately 80% voter approval to provide \$560,000 in revenue to supplement the General Fund operation of the School District. With the patrons supporting the passage of the levy, the school district was able to provide the classes, programs and necessary teaching staff to meet the educational needs of all the students.

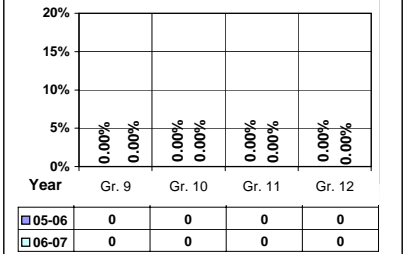

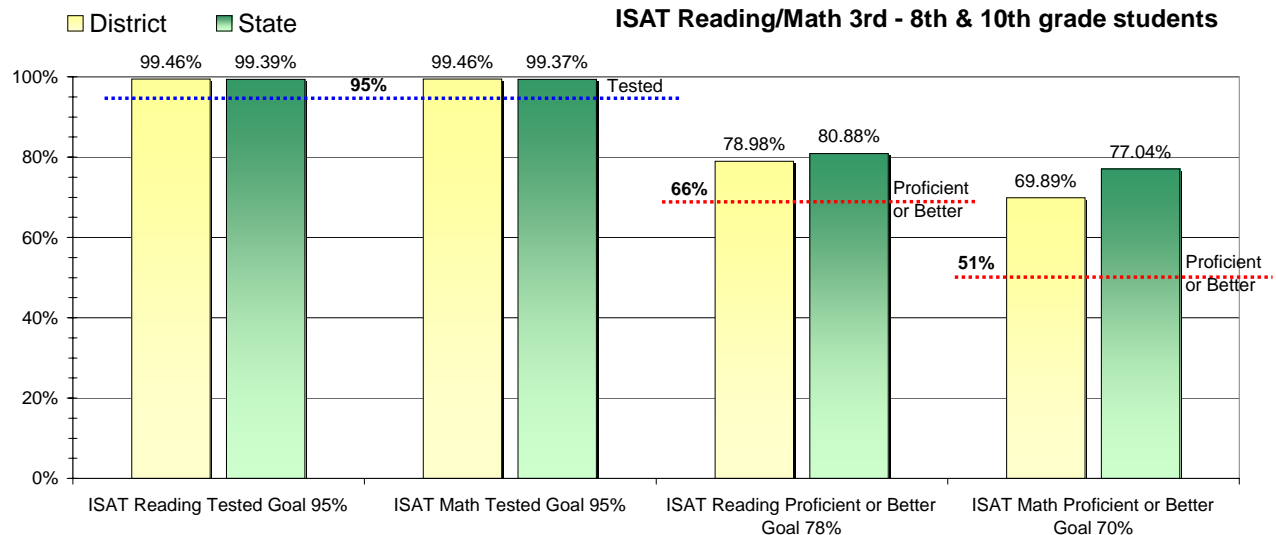
Adequate Yearly Progress and Assessment 2006-07
