Highlights

- All of our seniors achieved at or above the proficiency standard scores on the ISAT for math, language arts, and reading.
- The District Strategic Planning Committee reviewed the District Vision, Mission, and Philosophy Statement.
- Ten Year Maintenance Plan was developed.
- Pre-School scientifically researched based reading series was purchased and implemented.
- Funding was secured through a grant from The Nez Perce Tribe to continue the sixth year of the district's "All Day Everyday Kindergarten".
- The entire District's classified and certified staff meets the NCLB Highly Qualified Requirements.
- The District is financially solvent.
- The District was able to fill all its teaching positions with certified staff properly endorsed for their teaching assignments.
- The District and KHS Staff developed plans to reinstitute the Ag./Science Prog. for 2007-08 school year.
- District transportation route were reorganized so costs would not exceed the State 103% cap.
- The Kamiah High School Extracurricular Programs were highly competitive and successful.
- Kamiah Schools benefited from numerous parents and community members willingly donating their time.
- The Kamiah High School met all but the third indicator, graduation rate for AYP standards in 2006-2007.

Focus Area #6: Logistical Support.

Goal #1: The Kamiah School District will provide the best possible physical and educational environment within its financial means to support quality education for all its stakeholders.

Achieved by most grade levels. Building Action Planning Committees developed action plans and entered them on the new State Continues Improvement Plan. All 2007 graduates meet the ISAT proficiency requirements.

Reading, Language arts lessons aligned with new scientifically research based curriculum purchased by the district. Certified and Classified staff in-serviced on best use.

100% of kindergarten and first grade met the goal. Second and third grade were several students short of reaching the 85% goal.

District Policy Handbook is updated annually to address legislative changes. Copies of policies are available in each building and the district office for stakeholder use. Crisis plan for the district is being updated to reflect best practices.

K-4, 5-8 grades have active PTO organizations. The Indian Ed. Parent Committee works with K-12 educational staff and programs. KHS Parent Booster Club supports athletic and academic programs.

All Kamiah certified and classified staff meet NCLB highly qualified standards and State certification and endorsement requirements.

KHS provides G/T and Advanced Placement courses through the IDLA program. Strong core classes in math, language arts, science, and social studies are supported at each grade level. Algebra is available in the eighth grade. Efforts are in process to bring an Ag/science program back into grades 8-12.

Grant writing is being pursued by staff and patrons to support existing programs and increase educational opportunities for students. The District developed a 10 year maintenance plan to address building and site needs.

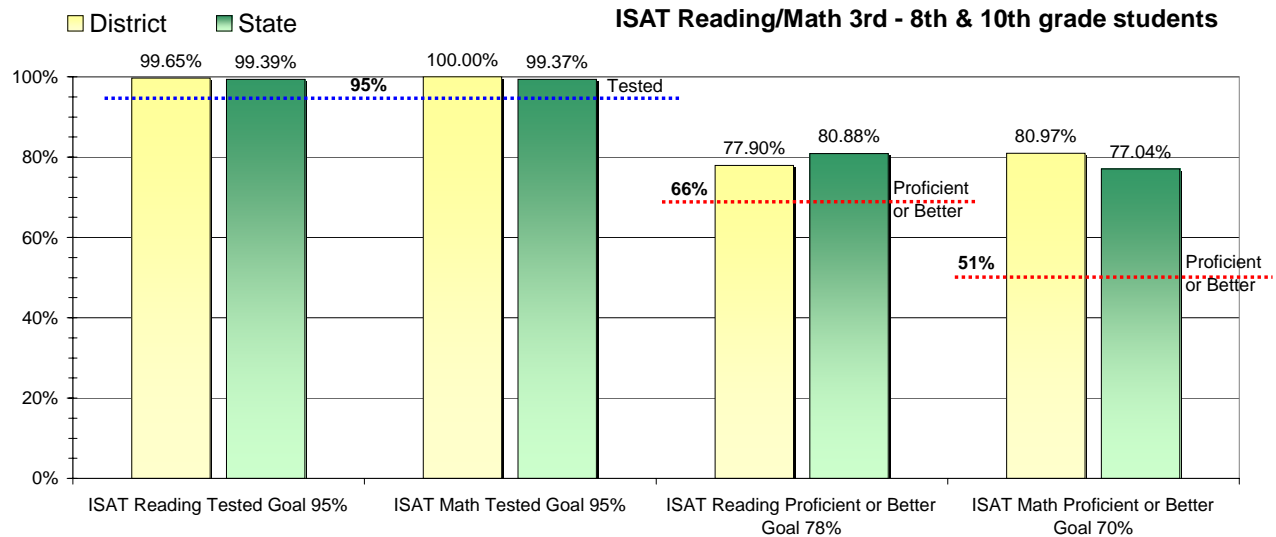
Adequate Yearly Progress and Assessment 2006-07
