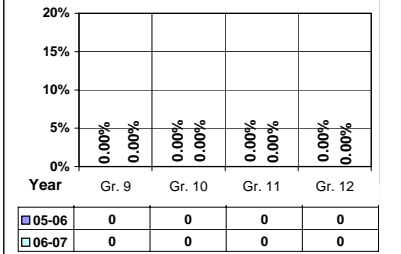

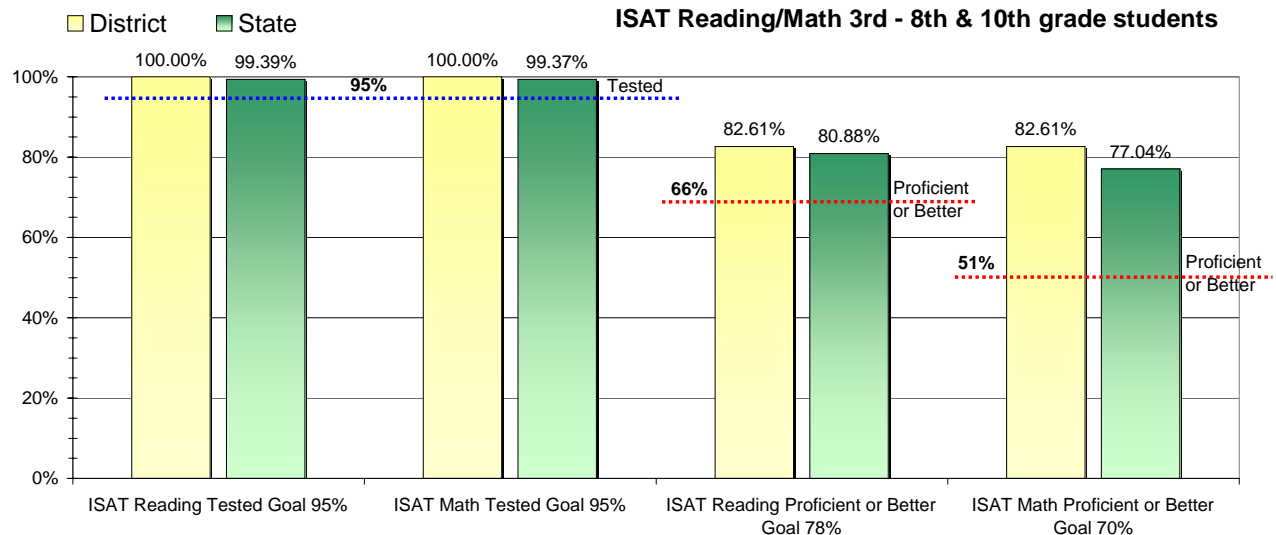
Adequate Yearly Progress and Assessment 2006-07
