

IDAHO SYSTEM FOR EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE (ISEE)

Beginning with the 2012 school year, the State of Idaho has opened the Idaho System for Educational Excellence which will be used to track student performance during their enrollment in the State of Idaho. Teachers throughout the state can use this tool to monitor student, course and teacher success in many of the standardized measures given throughout the year.

GETTING ACCOUNT SET UP

1. If you have not registered for a login to any of the sites within the Idaho State Department of Education, please: Navigate using **Microsoft Internet Explorer** or **Apple (Mac) Safari** to <http://apps.sde.idaho.gov/account>
 - a. Choose 'Register' from the menu, which is listed as option 2.
 - b. Use your school district email address as your username and a unique password containing 1 capital letter, 1 lower case letter and 1 number with a minimum of 6 characters.
 - c. You will receive a follow-up email from the Idaho State Department of Education once your account has been authorized.
 - i. Please keep this, and passwords secure at all times.

ACCESSING ISEE

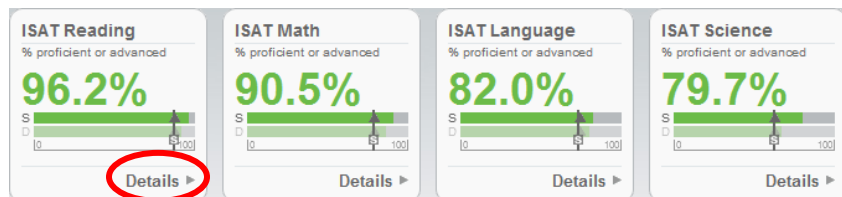
You must log in order to use ISEE / Schoolnet. Additionally, in the district, you must access the site via **Microsoft Internet Explorer** or **Apple (Mac) Safari**.

1. Navigate your browser to <http://isee.sde.idaho.gov>
2. Enter the username (district email address) and password that you created. Click Log In.
3. Click the [Go to KPI Dashboard](#) link near the test summary results listed.
 - a. This will take you to all of the data points available to you as a teacher.
 - b. Currently includes ISAT, IRI, IELA and student demographics as of the last upload.
 - i. Standardized test results may be delayed by several months after release.
 - ii. Student demographics are uploaded monthly by our district office to the service.
4. Read and accept the acceptable use policy (one time needed).

THE KPI (KEY PERFORMANCE INDICATORS) DASHBOARD

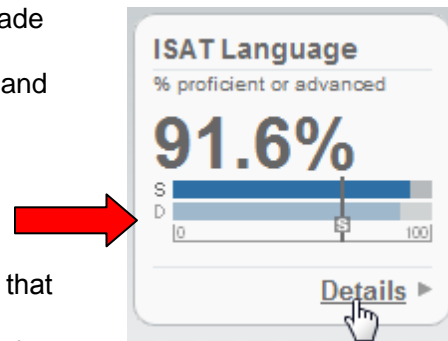
The dashboard allows you to see all statewide data points associated with your building in one place. You can navigate deeper within the data by:

- Clicking on the individual name of the individual test, grade, subject or teacher.
- Clicking the **DETAILS** > button at the bottom of each area.
- Using the drop down buttons ▼ to change schools (if given access), grade levels, tests or teachers.
 - Available subgroups include ethnicity, special education status and others of district discretion.



In this example:

- 91.6% of the users at this school scored at least proficient
 - (represented by the top 'S' horizontal bar).
- Looking visually or rolling the cursor over the 'D' bar for the value indicates that the school outperformed the district average percent proficient.
- The vertical 'S' line indicates the state value (roll over the 'S' to view percent).



- A horizontal teacher bar ('T') would be visible if looking from a teacher dashboard.

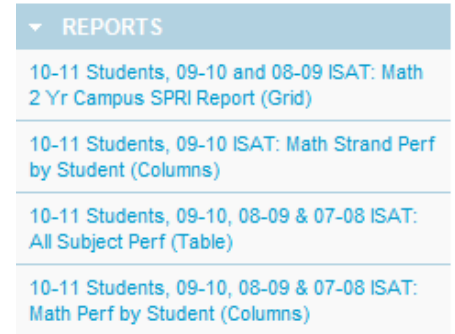
Filtering:

- You can filter the views and the calculation of the data points by turning on or turning off certain filters:
 - Click on a particular grade level or subgroup to filter.

REPORTING OPTIONS

Within the dashboard, a series of reports will be available along the right-hand side which will change based on the type of data that you are reviewing.

- By hovering the mouse over an individual report, a template will be visible that allows you to see the parameters.
- Click on the report to delimit the report by:
 - Grade level
 - Student details or characteristics.
 - Convert the report to Microsoft Excel or other formats.



Compare results across grade level and subsection. (When you are done reviewing the report, click Back to Previous Page to return to the KPI detail screen.) The report:

- Displays student currently enrolled at the school by previous year test level and subsection.
- Indicates percent of students in each score group.
- Total Unique indicates the number of test takers for that test level.

SPRI Growth Report

Although it is essential to know how many students are proficient and not proficient, it may be even more instructionally useful to know which students actually improved or declined from one year to the next. The SPRI Growth Report compares most recent to prior year scores and breaks students into four quadrants: proficient/declining, proficient/improving, not proficient/improving and not proficient/ declining. This report can be run for ISAT Math, Reading, Science or Language. It can run for the state, a district or school. Users at the district and school level have the ability to see the names of the students who make up each quadrant and sort based on performance. Only students with scores for the last two assessments are included.

THE STUDENT DIGITAL BACKPACK

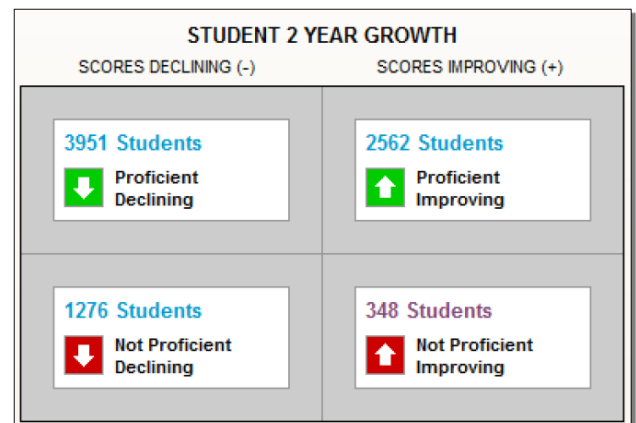
Student Profiles (AKA "Digital Backpack") include all data that is available in ISEE about each student. Currently ISAT, IRI, and IELA data is loaded into ISEE with additional tests to come. Individual student data is highly sensitive and may be regulated by local, state and federal laws. Always exercise extreme caution in viewing, analyzing and acting on this information.

What is SPRI?

The Student Proficiency Ranking Index (SPRI) is a method in which to compare assessments that may have different numbering scales. It measures the relative proximity to the cut score. A SPRI score of zero equals proficiency. Students with a negative number are not proficient. For more information, read the SPRI white paper attached at the bottom of the report.

Purpose of the Report

In a population with a high proportion of proficient students, this report is a useful tool for seeing if those students are in fact improving from one year to the next. This report can be used to identify student who, while currently proficient, may be in danger of slipping to not proficient. Additionally, it indicates which not proficient students were close to being proficient on their most recent ISAT.




Parts of the Report


In addition to the four quadrants, below the table the total numbers of declining and improving students are listed (regardless of proficiency). To the right is the total proficient and not proficient, regardless of score movement. Use the 'Back to Previous Page' link at the bottom of the report to return to the KPI Dashboard.

Note: For district and school users, all numbers in blue can be clicked to reveal the names of the students making up the category.

1. On the KPI Dashboard (Account home page), click Details in one of the ISAT KPIs.
2. Click the applicable SPRI Report (Grid).

1. Navigate to the  at the upper-right hand corner of the screen.
2. Students are searchable by first name, last name or state identification number (9 digits).
 - a. Pick the student from the drop-down menu and select them with a click of the mouse.
 - b. Choose the parameters desired for a report.

Tabs in the Digital Backpack

Student Overview	Personal information, current year marks and benchmark results that highlight strong and weak standards.
Standardized Tests	<p>Performance on all standardized tests that have been loaded into the system, arranged by school year. Detailed Performance Tables link to the full test information, including sub-section results if available. Score Group Distribution Chart indicates the score group of everyone who took this test at the same time and same school as the student.</p> 
Growth Reports	Comparison in the student's score from most recent to prior year and measures changes in an individual student's SPRI Scores (Student Proficiency Ranking Index) over time. Non-proficient students have SPRIs that are less than zero. The closer the SPRI is to zero, the closer that student is to proficiency.
Enrollment and Academic Record	<p>Current and historical enrollment.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Schools would also be able to look at academic history, attendance and test scores if the student has transferred intra-state.
Programs	Indicates program enrollment including LEP status and bus ridership.

Families throughout the State of Idaho will soon be granted access to ISEE / School Net. There, they will be able to see individual reports for their student as well as the proficiency rates for their currently scheduled teachers, grade level and school.



USER SETTINGS

1. **Log Out** - When finished with ISEE / Schoolnet tasks, you should log out to prevent unauthorized access to data. Either close your browser or click the **Log Out** link in the upper right portion of the screen.
2. **User Feedback** - A quick poll on a variety of topics based on questions generated by the Idaho State Department of Education.
3. **My Settings** - You may have the ability to create your own user preferences based on the depth of student data made available to your username.
 - a. Site preferences - Identify the home area and the buttons you would like to have available.
 - b. Communications preferences - ensure that you receive communication as to when the system is available for your use and how it is adapting.
