



Goal #1- Objective #5; Strategy #1: Migrant families will be supported through parent meetings and individual family communication in order to increase Migrant student graduation percentages.

The Migrant families have been supported through active parent meetings in various schools within the Vallivue School District to accommodate their travel and work schedule. Last year (2007-2008), we accomplished three (3) small PAC meetings and two (2) conferences. The conferences include: motivational keynote speaker, eight (8) presentations by experts in the specific topics that are chosen by the parents, additional informational booths, continental breakfast and lunch, educational activities for all the children, so parents can focus in their learning, and volunteer opportunities for active student-led club members and caring staff. The total number of parents that registered during one of the two conferences for which we have records for is 28.

For the 2008-2009 school year we had one (1) big PAC meeting, four (4) small PAC meetings, and one (1) conference. The total number of parents that registered during our most recent conference is 51. This year we have an active PAC with official officers who will be trained by our Migrant Region I- Regional Coordinator to lead effectively. The typed-list of parents that registered during the last two (2) school years is included for your consideration. We actively motivate parents to communicate with their Family Liaisons in their schools for support in regards to academic or disciplinary concerns that they may have.

The Vallivue School District identified a direct correlation between the Migrant students that have graduated and the current dropout rate. We currently do not have the data for the Migrant students who have graduated; however, the dropout rate has decreased. Our records include the following data: In the 2005-2006 school year we had seven (7) Migrant students, in 2007-2008 we had three (3) Migrant students, and in the proceeding school year, as of December 1, 2008, we had zero (0) Migrant students on our dropout list. The Migrant ISAF Comparison for ISAF's from spring 2007-Spring 2008 chart demonstrates an increased average of 5% Migrant student proficiency level in the area of Math in grades 3rd 10th. Using the same chart, the area of Reading demonstrates an increased average of 19% Migrant student proficiency level. Please refer to the chart, which has been included for your consideration.

Evaluation: The percentage of families participating in parent meetings and the percentage of Migrant students graduating will each increase by 3% in spring 2009.
