

# The Optional SAT with Essay in Idaho

Your school has registered you to take the April 13, 2021 SAT® School Day. You can choose to add the Essay to your registration for free. If you would like to take the SAT® with Essay, you must add the Essay to your registration in your own College Board account between January 22 and February 5, 2021. Both the SAT without Essay and the SAT with Essay meet the state College Entrance Exam graduation requirement.

## About the SAT with Essay

- The SAT with Essay will take approximately one hour longer than the SAT.
- It's your choice. You decide whether or not to take the SAT with Essay.
- The SAT Essay is scored separately from the SAT and does not impact your Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score.

## Why Take the SAT with Essay?

The SAT Essay lets you practice your skills and gives you a chance to show colleges that you're ready for college-level writing assignments. Some colleges may specifically require it as a part of the admission process (we recommend that you confirm admission policies with your school of choice).

## It's About the Real World

The SAT with Essay is a lot like a typical college writing assignment that asks you to analyze a text. It shows colleges you're ready to get to campus and write.

You'll have 50 minutes to:

- Read a passage
- Explain how the author builds an argument to persuade an audience
- Support your explanation with evidence from the passage

## Register for the SAT with Essay

You can take the SAT with Essay at no additional cost. You must register between **January 22 and February 5, 2021**.

### REGISTER ONLINE:

Register online before 10:00 p.m. Mountain Time (MT) on February 5, 2021, using your College Board account.

- 1 Go to [sat.org](https://sat.org) and sign into your College Board account. If you've forgotten your username or password, click the link to recover them. Please do NOT create a new account. Once you're signed in, click on your username in the upper right-hand corner. Then select "**My SAT**."
- 2 If you do not have a College Board Account, go to [sat.org](https://sat.org) and click "Register Now." Choose "Sign Up" and complete the required fields (name, sex, DOB, email address, expected HS graduation date) to create your account. Click "Continue" on the SAT Registration page. Review and complete the "Personal Info," "Your High School," and "Your Mailing Address" screens. You may be asked to provide "Your Previous Registration Number." Choose "Yes" and enter the registration number provided by your counselor.
- 3 Select "**Change Registration**" from the My SAT homepage. If you don't see your registration listed here, call customer service at 855-373-6387 for assistance.
- 4 Select "**Add the essay to my registration**" from the Change Your Registration page." Once the "Add the essay to my registration" link is selected, a confirmation message will appear. Click "**OK**" to continue. Congratulations! You're registered for the SAT with Essay.
- 5 If you decide later on that you would like to remove the essay from your registration, sign into your College Board account and select "**Remove the essay from my registration**" before **February 5, 2021**. Test day changes to add or remove the essay will not be allowed.
