FINAL ORDER

Respondent

The Chief Certification Officer for the State of Idaho filed an Administrative Complaint against the educator certificates issued to Ryan J. Bryson, seeking for the Professional Standards Commission to impose discipline on Mr. Bryson's certificates. *See* Idaho Code § 33-1209. Because Mr. Bryson did not request a hearing within 30 days, and because Mr. Bryson was determined to be in default by a hearing/presiding officer, the allegations in the Administrative Complaint are treated as admitted, Idaho Code § 33-1209(3), and are incorporated by reference as findings of fact.

Based on these findings, the Professional Standards Commission concludes that Mr. Bryson's conduct or course of conduct violated Idaho Code § 33-1208(2)(b)("The professional standards commission shall permanently revoke any certificate issued or authorized under the provisions of section 33-1201, Idaho Code, and shall deny the application for issuance of a certificate of a person who pleads guilty to or is found guilty of, notwithstanding the form of the judgment or withheld judgment, any of the following felony offenses . . . Aggravated battery, section 18-907.").

Under Idaho Code § 33-1208, the Professional Standards Commission orders that the following discipline (as marked) be imposed on Mr. Bryson's certificates:

RECONSIDERATION AND JUDICIAL REVIEW

This is a final order of the Professional Standards Commission. Any party may file a motion for reconsideration of this order within 14 days of the service date of this order. The agency will dispose of the petition for reconsideration within 21 days of its receipt; if not, the petition will be denied as a matter of law. See Idaho Code § 67-5246. Petitions for reconsideration may be filed by mail addressed to the Professional Standards Commission, State Department of Education, P.O. Box 83720, Boise, ID 83720-0027, or hand delivered to the Commission at 650 West State Street, Second Floor, Boise, ID 83720.

Any party aggrieved by this final order or orders previously issued in this case may seek judicial review of the orders in this case in district court. A party may do this by filing a petition for judicial review in the district court as provided in Idaho Code §§ 67-5270 and 67-5272. The petition must be filed within 28 days of the service date of this final order; or, if a motion for reconsideration is filed, within 28 days of the service of a decision on the motion for reconsideration or denial of the motion as a matter of law. Idaho Code § 67-5273. The filing of a petition for judicial review does not itself stay the effectiveness or enforcement of the agency action. Idaho Code § 67-5274.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

Respondent

Lisa Colón Durham, Chief Certification Officer for the State of Idaho, alleges the following against Ryan J. Bryson ("Respondent").

GENERAL AVERMENTS

- 1. The Professional Standards Commission (Commission) regulates teacher certification in Idaho.
- 2. The Chief Certification Officer is empowered to file an administrative complaint against the certificate of a teacher or other individual certified under the authority of the Idaho State Board of Education. Idaho Code § 33-1209.
- 3. Mr. Bryson holds the following certificates and endorsements issued under the authority of the Idaho State Board of Education:
 - a. Administrator with Superintendent (Pre-K-12) endorsement, effective January 25, 2019, through August 31, 2021, and School Principal (Pre-K-12) endorsement, effective August 8, 2018, through August 31, 2021).
 - b. Standard Instructional Certificate with Mathematics (6-12) endorsement, effective May 23, 2016, through August 31, 2021.
- 4. On January 15, 2013, Mr. Bryson entered a Rule 11 Plea Agreement to the charges of Attempted Strangulation, Idaho Code § 18-923(1), a felony, and Aggravated Battery, Idaho Code § 18-907(1)(a) and/or (1)(b), 18-903, a felony.
- 5. An Amended Judgment of Conviction and Order Retaining Jurisdiction was entered on May 1, 2013, based upon the plea agreement.

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT – 1 Ryan J. Bryson

6. On August 6, 2014, the Professional Standards Commission held a contested case hearing based upon his criminal judgment.

7. The hearing panel issued Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law and Final Order on August 15, 2014.

8. After hearing testimony, considering all of the evidence, and arguments in favor of and against discipline, the hearing panel suspended Mr. Bryson's right to reapply for an educator certificate pending the successful completion of his criminal law probation.

9. The hearing panel further found that if Mr. Bryson was otherwise eligible for an educator certificate after providing documentation to the Chief Certification Officer of the successful completion of his criminal probation, then the Chief Certification "shall issue the Certificate."

10. On April 25, 2016, the District Court issued an Order Terminating Probation and Reducing Felonies to Misdemeanors.

- 11. On August 4, 2016, Mr. Bryson's educator certificates were reinstated.
- 12. On July 1, 2020, Idaho Code §§ 33-1208 and 33-1209 were amended.
- 13. Idaho Code § 33-1208(2) was amended to require the permanent revocation of an individual who committed certain felony offenses against not just a child, but anyone:
 - a. The professional standards commission shall permanently revoke any certificate issued or authorized under the provisions of section 33–1201. Idaho Code, and shall deny the application for issuance of a certificate of a person who pleads guilty to or is found guilty of, notwithstanding the form of the judgment or withheld judgment...

- 14. One of the enumerated offenses requiring permanent revocation under Idaho Code § 33-1208(2) is subsection (b), which is aggravated battery, Idaho Code § 18-907.
 - 15. Idaho Code § 33-1208(4) was amended to include the following:
 - a. Any person holding a certificate on or before July 1, 2020, who would not be eligible for a certificate by virtue of the provisions of this section shall be afforded a hearing according to the provisions of section 33-1209, Idaho Code, prior to revocation or denial of the individual's certificate. Upon a showing of just and reasonable cause, the hearing panel shall have authority to grant an exception to the provisions of this section for such person.
 - 16. Idaho Code § 33-1208(4) applies retroactively.

Count I

17. Mr. Bryson's conduct or course of conduct violated Idaho Code § 33-1208(2)(b)(Aggravated battery, section 18-907).

REQUEST FOR RELIEF

The Chief Certification Officer requests that the Commission grant the following relief, as permitted under Idaho Code §§ 33-1208 and 33-1209:

- 1. Permanently revoke Mr. Bryson's certificates.
- 2. That if Mr. Bryson requests a hearing, a hearing be conducted before a hearing panel, where the Chief Certification Officer and Mr. Bryson may present evidence concerning the allegations in the Administrative Complaint, to aid the hearing panel in determining whether Mr. Bryson's certificate should be disciplined and, if so, what discipline should be imposed.

- 3. That after a hearing, the waiver of a hearing, or Mr. Bryson's failure to file an Answer to the Administrative Complaint, the hearing panel issue findings of fact and conclusions of law finding the violations of law alleged herein.
 - 4. Any other relief that would be just under the circumstances.

NOTIFICATION OF PROCEDURAL RIGHTS

The Professional Standards Commission wishes to notify you of the following rights.

An administrative action has been initiated against your certificate(s). Under Idaho Code § 33-1209, if you wish to contest the allegations set forth in the administrative complaint, you must request a hearing. The request must be (1) made not more than 30 days after the date of service (mailing) of the administrative complaint, (2) in writing, and (3) addressed to the state superintendent of public instruction. If you do not request a hearing or do not comply with the requirements for requesting a hearing, the allegations in the administrative complaint will be treated as admitted under Idaho Code § 33-1209(3).

In response to the administrative complaint, you must file an answer pursuant to IDAPA rule 04.11.01.270, but you must file the answer at least 30 days prior to the day of the hearing.

You have the right to be represented by legal counsel, at your own expense, during the administrative proceeding. In addition, you are entitled to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of books, documents, and other things relevant to the proceedings.

The administrative proceeding is governed by provisions of the Idaho Code, including the Idaho Administrative Procedure Act, and by provisions of the Idaho Administrative Code, including the Idaho Rules of Administrative Procedure of the Attorney General that have been adopted by the Board of Education. You may access these laws and rules online or via the Idaho State Law Library.
