Title IC – Migrant & Title III Reallocation Process	
October 16 - 30, 2015	<p><b>Reallocation Timeline for Excess Carryover* of Title IC/III Funds</b> In the event that a LEA has an excess of Title IC/III funds, they will be notified and given an opportunity to justify unused funds or they may voluntarily return funds. The ISDE shall adhere to following timeline:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No later than <b>October 16, 2015</b>, ISDE shall send the Intent to Use Excess Carryover form to each LEA that has excess carryover funds to determine if they will expend the excess funds prior to the end of the grant period.</li> <li>No later than <b>October 30, 2015</b>, the LEA shall submit the Intent Form for ISDE approval. If the LEA chooses not to submit the form, or does not respond by the deadline, the funds will be reallocated.</li> </ol> <p><b>*The definition of excess carryover is defined as a fund balance more than 40% of the original allocation. For example, an LEA received an original allocation of \$100,000 for SY13-14 and has a remaining balance of \$40,000 or more on October 16, 2015.</b></p>
November 6, 2015 – January 8, 2016	<p><b>Application Timeline for Reallocated Title IC/III Funds for LEAs</b> Any eligible LEA interested in receiving reallocated funds shall adhere to the following timeline:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>No later than November 6, 2015, ISDE shall send an Application for Reallocated Funds to eligible LEAs</li> <li>No later than December 4, 2015, the LEA shall submit the Application for Reallocated Funds to <a href="mailto:cnav@sd.idaho.gov">cnav@sd.idaho.gov</a></li> <li>No later than January 8, 2016, ISDE shall reallocate all unused funds to LEAs with an approved CFSGA and approved Application for Reallocated Funds</li> </ol> <p><b>Districts returning funds for reallocation will not be eligible for a reallocation award.</b></p>
