➢ Rural and Low-Income School Program (RLIS)



- It is the purpose of Title V, Part B to address the unique needs of rural school districts that frequently—
- ➢lack the personnel and resources needed to compete effectively for Federal competitive grants; and
- receive formula grant allocations in amounts too small to be effective in meeting their intended purposes.

ESSA Section 5201



Rural school districts and rural public charter schools must meet one of the following criteria:

- Fewer than 20 enrolled students per square mile within the area encompassed by the school district's boundaries, or
- School districts within a county containing less than 25,000 residents based on the most recent United States census
- Public charter school if the school district in which the public charter school is physically located meets the definition of a rural school district



A local educational agency (LEA) shall be eligible if—

- ➤ the total number of students in average daily attendance (ADA) at all of the schools served by the local educational agency is fewer than 600; or
- Seach county in which a school served by the local educational agency is located has a total population density of fewer than 10 persons per square mile; and
- ➢all of the schools served by the local educational agency are designated with a locale code of 41, 42, or 43, as determined by the Secretary;

ESSA Section 5211(b)(1)(A)



An eligible local educational agency (LEA) may use the applicable funding that the agency is eligible to receive from the State educational agency (SEA) for a fiscal year to carry out local activities authorized under any of the following provisions:

- ➢Part A of title I
- ➢Part A of title II
- ≻Title III
- ➢Part A or B of title IV

RLIS Eligibility



A local educational agency (LEA) shall be eligible to receive a grant under this subpart if—

- ➤ 20 percent or more of the children ages 5 through 17 years served by the local educational agency (LEA) are from families with incomes below the poverty line; and
- ➢All of the schools served by the agency are designated with a locale code of 32, 33, 41, 42, or 43, as determined by the Secretary; or the agency meets the criteria established
- ➢Grant awards are according to a formula based on the number of students in average daily attendance (ADA) served by the eligible local educational agencies (LEAs)



Grant funds awarded to local educational agencies (LEAs) under this subpart shall be used for any of the following:

- Activities authorized under part A of title I
- ➤Activities authorized under part A of title II
- ➤Activities authorized under title III
- ➢Activities authorized under part A of title IV
- Parental involvement activities
