Title V-B Program Purpose



It is the purpose of Title V, Part B to address the unique needs of rural school districts that frequently—

- lack the personnel and resources needed to compete effectively for Federal competitive grants; and
- receive formula grant allocations in amounts too small to be effective in meeting their intended purposes.

ESSA Section 5201

Idaho Definition of Rural Schools



Rural school districts and rural public charter schools must meet one of the following criteria:

- Fewer than 20 enrolled students per square mile within the area encompassed by the school district's boundaries, or
- School districts within a county containing less than 25,000 residents based on the most recent United States census
- Public charter school if the school district in which the public charter school is physically located meets the definition of a rural school district

[Idaho Code 33-319](#)

SRSA Eligibility



A local educational agency (LEA) shall be eligible if—

- the total number of students in average daily attendance (ADA) at all of the schools served by the local educational agency is fewer than 600; or
- each county in which a school served by the local educational agency is located has a total population density of fewer than 10 persons per square mile; and
- all of the schools served by the local educational agency are designated with a locale code of 41, 42, or 43, as determined by the Secretary;

ESSA Section 5211(b)(1)(A)

SRSA Use of Funds



An eligible local educational agency (LEA) may use the applicable funding that the agency is eligible to receive from the State educational agency (SEA) for a fiscal year to carry out local activities authorized under any of the following provisions:

- Part A of title I
- Part A of title II
- Title III
- Part A or B of title IV

Alternative Use of Funds Authority (AFUA)

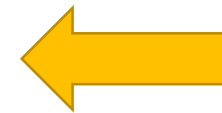
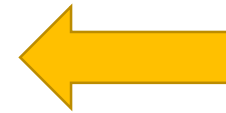

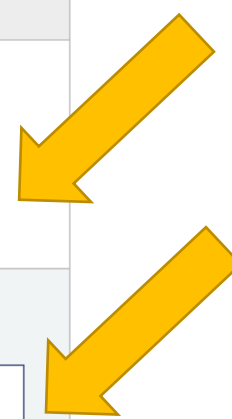

- Grant awards are according to a formula based on the number of students in average daily attendance (ADA) served by the eligible local educational agencies (LEAs)

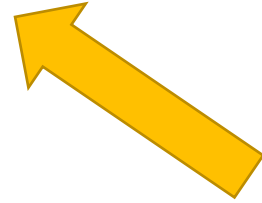

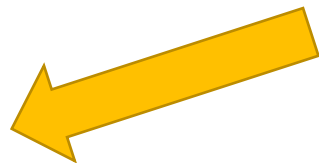

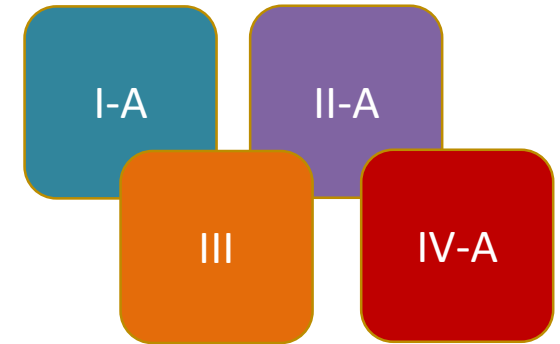
