Advanced Opportunities


The Idaho State Department of Education, Driver Education Program supports using Advanced Opportunity funds for driver education courses in the amount of up to \$225.00 per overload course. The following criteria must be met:

- A student must take and successfully be completing a full credit load within a given school year to be eligible for funding of an overload course.
- An overload course must be taken for high school credit to be eligible for funding.
- "Overload course" means a course taken that is in excess of a full credit load and outside of the regular school day, including summer courses.
- "Full credit load" means at least twelve (12) credits per school year for grades 7 12. Full credit load requirements may vary between districts and charters.
- "School year" means the normal school year that begins upon the conclusion of the spring semester leading up to the break between grades and ends upon the beginning of the same break of the following year.

Public Driver Education programs would receive up to \$350 per eligible student; \$125 reimbursed from the State Department of Education Driver Education fund and up to \$225 paid from the Advanced Opportunities fund. Students would be responsible for paying the remaining fees for driver education programs charging in excess of \$350 per student.
