Dear Teachers, Counselors, Principals, and School Resource Officers,


My name is Tabitha Smith and I'm the Occupant Protection Program Manager for the Idaho Office of Highway Safety. I'm writing you today because the Office of Highway Safety is working to increase seat belt use among young drivers. In 2020, there were 14 teen drivers killed, and only 4 of those teen drivers were wearing seat belts. There were also 8 teen motor vehicle passengers killed in crashes, and only 2 of them were wearing seat belts. Seat belt use can reduce your risk of fatal injury by 50%, and the Office of Highway Safety is committed to helping teens recognize the importance of buckling up – every trip, every time.

Below is a scholarship opportunity for both students and schools to compete in the *Idaho Battle of the Belts* competition. I request that you please share this opportunity with your students. The deadline for submissions is **February 28, 2022.**
