Greetings Idaho Instructors,

May is a busy month for teachers <u>and</u> traffic safety. I know you are working on finishing up another difficult year of teaching and the end is in sight. Congratulations! For traffic safety, May is National Bicycle Safety Awareness, Motorcycle Safety Awareness, and Youth Traffic Safety Awareness month. We all know that these groups represent the most vulnerable roadway users. So we could call May Vulnerable Roadway User Month, however, it doesn't roll off the tongue as well. As the weather warms up, we are going to see more people riding their





motorcycles, biking to work, or heading to the park

to play. We need to protect these people by being engaged drivers. We also need to teach our students what being engaged *truly* means. Focusing on driving, putting our phones away, using our turn signals, and buckling up every time we get behind the wheel will help keep Idaho's youth, bikes, and motorcycles safe this summer.

Memorial Day is the start to Idaho's 100 Deadliest Days. Using the ITD Safety Dashboards, here are Idaho's fatality counts for the last 5 years: 2016—94, 2017—91, 2018—104, 2019—92, 2020—88. Please share this information with your students and let's work together to keep this number low in 2021.

**Safety Dashboards**—Online data on Idaho crashes through ITD and Numetric. See almost up-to-date data on Idaho crashes from 2016 to May 2021. This program allows you to filter specific information or look at just your city or neighborhood. It is a great tool for students to see the causes of crashes on the roads they drive. Instructors have told me they are adding this data in their classes and parent nights. Complete the assignment for 2 hours of Professional Development.

**2020 Virtual Highway Safety Summit**—Videos are still available to view on YouTube. Colonel Wills of the Idaho State Police gave the keynote address "Can I Make a Difference?". This was a very engaging and motivating presentation and I highly recommend you watch. His brother and other officers presented "Positive Communities" and what they are doing to keep involved and active in their communities across Idaho. Our State Traffic Safety Prosecuting Attorney, Jared Olsen, presented a 2020 Traffic Case Law Update. This will give you a different point of view about traffic stops and the job our law enforcement officers have to complete to keep our roads safe. There are a few other videos available for a total of 5.5 hours of Professional Development. Complete a short summary of the videos you watch and answer the question "How could I use this in Driver Ed?"
